



FROM FATHER TOM

Happy Divine Mercy Sunday! We had a wonderful Easter and now we celebrate this wonderful feast which falls on the Sunday after Easter. The origins of Divine Mercy goes back during the rise of Nazism and the reign of Hitler. The message and devotion to Jesus as The Divine

Mercy is based on the writings of Saint Faustina Kowalska, an uneducated Polish nun who, in obedience to her spiritual director, wrote a diary of about 600 pages recording the revelations she received about God's mercy. Even before her death in 1938, the devotion to The Divine Mercy had begun to spread. Pope John Paul II had great affinity towards this devotion and authorized it in the Liturgical Calendar of the Roman Catholic Church. Today it is celebrated throughout the world.

The Divine Mercy message is one we can call to mind simply by remembering ABC:

- A Ask for His Mercy. God wants us to approach Him in prayer constantly, repenting of our sins and asking Him to pour His mercy out upon us and upon the whole world.
- B Be merciful. God wants us to receive His mercy and let it flow through us to others. He wants us to extend love and forgiveness to others just as He does to us.
- C Completely trust in Jesus. God wants us to know that all the graces of His mercy can only be received by our trust. The more we open the door of our hearts and lives to Him with trust, the more we can receive.

Please join us as we honor our Lord and seek His mercy for ourselves and our world. Sunday, April 7 at **3:00 p.m**. After all who doesn't need God's mercy?



¡Feliz Domingo de la Divina Misericordia! Hemos tenido una Pascua maravillosa y ahora celebramos esta maravillosa fiesta que cae el domingo después de Pascua. Los orígenes de la Divina Misericordia se remontan al ascenso del nazismo y al reinado de Hitler. El mensaje y la devoción a Jesús como La Divina Misericordia se basa en los escritos de Santa Faustina Kowalska, una monja polaca sin educación que, en obediencia a su director espiritual, escribió un diario de unas 600 páginas registrando las revelaciones que recibió sobre la misericordia de Dios. Incluso antes de su muerte en 1938, la devoción a la Divina Misericordia había comenzado a extenderse. El

Papa Juan Pablo II tenía gran afinidad con esta devoción y la autorizó en el Calendario Litúrgico de la Iglesia Católica Romana. Hoy se celebra en todo el mundo.


Podemos evocar el mensaje de la Divina Misericordia simplemente recordando el ABC:

- A Pedir Su Misericordia. Dios quiere que nos acerquemos a Él en oración constantemente, arrepintiéndonos de nuestros pecados y pidiéndole que derrame su misericordia sobre nosotros y sobre el mundo entero.
- B Sé misericordioso. Dios quiere que recibamos Su misericordia y dejemos que fluya a través de nosotros hacia los demás. Él quiere que extendamos el amor y el perdón a los demás tal como Él lo hace con nosotros.
- C Confiar plenamente en Jesús. Dios quiere que sepamos que todas las gracias de Su misericordia sólo pueden ser recibidas por nuestra confianza. Cuanto más le abramos la puerta de nuestro corazón y de nuestra vida con confianza, más podremos recibir.

Por favor, únase a nosotros para honrar a nuestro Señor y buscar su misericordia para nosotros y nuestro mundo. Domingo, 7 de abril a las 3:00 p.m. ¿Después de todo quién no necesita la misericordia de Dios?

Peace Be With You

Chapter 20 of the Gospel of John emphasizes Peace and the Holy Spirit abiding within us. Christ's first word following His death is "Peace". I do not find that I am naturally a peaceful person. I tend to get easily distracted and upset by life not being "fair", or agitated when things do not go exactly as I had planned. I am flawed. Yet so much greater than this is that I am also loved. Above all else, Christ has laid down his life for me. I owe it to Him to do my best to try to find an inner peace. It is often a battle. My mind races at night, dwelling on what might go wrong. It is by listening to the word of God that I calmed down and am reminded of who I really am. Through dedicating my time to Him in prayer and good deeds, He will rejuvenate me, like the Living Water He declares to the Samaritan woman.

Again and again we must acknowledge that the Holy Spirit resides in each of us, guiding us, and that in each passing moment we can become more like Christ. Pope Benedict XVI explained, "Every person carries within himself, a project of God, a personal vocation, a personal idea of God, on what he is required to do in history to build His Church, a living temple of His presence." I have a calling, a reason for why God has created me, I was chosen for this life to share God's glory with those around me. We may not always know where we belong or how each passing moment might unfold. While I may not be at peace on my own accord, with God's grace, He will remain in me as a source of peace through the Holy Spirit. As I mentioned in the past, I'm fairly sure I heard him once as a young adult when I attended a psychic workshop with some friends. There was a very distinct voice that said, "Be true to yourself." Now I'm working on my prayer time and trying to keep my mind from going to other subjects or ideas. In fact, one recent night I was thanking God for the day and the next thing I knew I was off on to something

else. I giggled and said, "Sorry God, but that was no surprise to you." Let me start again.

So, I've resigned myself to working on prayer and have added a pray journal and if I never hear God talking to me directly, that's ok. Because I saw God today. I saw him in the beautiful sunrise I described to my sister over the phone. I see God in all his majesty every day driving to and from work. I see God in every picture of my niece, Maggie. Her silliness reminds me that God has given her the twenty plus years we didn't expect her to be with us. This past Saturday, I was honored to see the newly baptized and the joy that shone on their faces showed me God was truly here and present in our lives.

We can go to church every weekend, but unless we open our eyes, we'll never get to see God in all his majesty. The other day, a couple stopped by the office and asked for instructions on how to get into the Adoration Chapel. Grace was delighted that you didn't have to have a reserved time to visit. As I opened the door, turned on the lights and raised the curtain on the Chalice, I turned to see tears flowing from her eyes. I saw God today.

El otro día, una pareja pasó por la oficina y preguntó cómo llegar a la Capilla de la Adoración. Grace estaba encantada de que no fuera necesario reservar una hora para visitarla. Cuando abrí la puerta, encendí las luces y levanté la cortina del Cáliz, me giré y vi lágrimas brotando de sus ojos. Vi a Dios hoy.
