

As there is no meat or eating between meals on Ash Wednesday (and Good Friday), we are having pretzels at 5 o'clock before our six o'clock mass. Please join us.

FROM FATHER TOM

It is that time again. Lent. To help you have a good Lent I have offered the following information:

Lent is the 40-day preparation for the events surrounding Easter, namely the suffering, death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. It is observed by many major Christian denominations, including Lutheranism, Catholicism, and others.



Why is Lent 40 days long?

This reflects the time Jesus spent in the Judean desert. According to the books of Matthew, Mark, and Luke in the Bible, Jesus fasted for 40 days and forty nights and overcame direct temptations from Satan during this time.

What are the major special days during and around Lent?

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday. Holy Week is the final week of Lent, starting with Palm Sunday, when Jesus rode into Jerusalem. Then, Holy Thursday remembers the Last Supper, Good Friday commemorates Jesus' crucifixion, and, finally, Easter Sunday celebrates Jesus' resurrection.

Do you have to give something up for Lent, like meat or a habit?

Some Christian denominations practice fasting, prayer, and Bible study during Lent. These are not Biblical requirements, but many believers see these behaviors as ways to help them focus on the meaning of Jesus' life, sacrifice, and resurrection.

But if you know Jesus rose from the dead, why does Lent seem so dark and sad?

Jesus' suffering was physical, mental, and spiritual. He carried all the sins of the world on his shoulders so that we would not have to receive the punishment we deserve. God gave up everything for us, and the reverent tone of Lent is many Christians' way of recognizing and respecting this great price he paid.

Most importantly, however, this solemn time keeps Christians looking forward to Easter morning when Jesus triumphantly conquered sin and death. Because Jesus lived, died, and rose for us, we will enjoy eternal life with him in heaven.


Fasting—Catholics ages 18–59 are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means eating one full meal and two smaller meals that don't add up to a full meal. Snacking between meals is not allowed Abstinence- Catholics ages 14 and older are required to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday, and all Fridays of Lent. Abstinence means not eating meat or poultry.

DEL PADRE TOM

Ha llegado de nuevo ese momento: la Cuaresma. Para ayudarte a pasar una buena Cuaresma, te he ofrecido la siguiente información:

La Cuaresma es la preparación de 40 días para los acontecimientos que rodean la Pascua, es decir, el sufrimiento, la muerte, el entierro y la resurrección de Jesucristo. La celebran muchas de las principales denominaciones cristianas, entre ellas el luteranismo, el catolicismo y otras.

¿Por qué la Cuaresma dura 40 días?

Esto refleja el tiempo que Jesús pasó en el desierto de Judea. Según los libros de Mateo, Marcos y Lucas de la Biblia, Jesús ayunó durante 40 días y cuarenta noches y superó las tentaciones directas de Satanás durante este tiempo.

¿Cuáles son los días especiales más importantes durante y alrededor de la Cuaresma?

La Cuaresma comienza el Miércoles de Ceniza. La Semana Santa es la última semana de Cuaresma, que comienza con el Domingo de Ramos, cuando Jesús entró en Jerusalén. Luego, el Jueves Santo recuerda la Última Cena, el Viernes Santo conmemora la crucifixión de Jesús y, finalmente, el Domingo de Pascua celebra la resurrección de Jesús.

¿Tienes que renunciar a algo durante la Cuaresma, como la carne o un hábito?

Algunas denominaciones cristianas practican el ayuno, la oración y el estudio bíblico durante la Cuaresma. Estos no son requisitos bíblicos, pero muchos creyentes ven estas conductas como formas de ayudarlos a centrarse en el significado de la vida, el sacrificio y la resurrección de Jesús.

Pero si sabes que Jesús resucitó de entre los muertos, ¿por qué la Cuaresma parece tan oscura y triste?

El sufrimiento de Jesús fue físico, mental y espiritual. Llevó todos los pecados del mundo sobre sus hombros para que no tuviéramos que recibir el castigo que merecemos. Dios renunció a todo por nosotros, y el tono reverente de la Cuaresma es la forma en que muchos cristianos reconocen y respetan este gran precio que pagó.

Sin embargo, lo más importante es que este tiempo solemne hace que los cristianos esperen con ansias la mañana de Pascua, cuando Jesús conquistó triunfantemente el pecado y la muerte. Debido a que Jesús vivió, murió y resucitó por nosotros, disfrutaremos de la vida eterna con él en el cielo.

Ayuno: los católicos de entre 18 y 59 años deben ayunar el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. El ayuno significa comer una comida completa y dos comidas más pequeñas que no sumen una comida completa. No se permite comer bocadillos entre comidas.

Abstinencia: los católicos de 14 años o más deben abstenerse de comer carne el Miércoles de Ceniza, el Viernes Santo y todos los viernes de Cuaresma. La abstinencia significa no comer carne ni aves.

Be merciful just as your Father is merciful

My Take

"Be merciful as your Father is merciful." Easier said than done. We're usually particularly good at showing mercy to our friends and family, after all, they show it back in kind. Showing mercy to someone having a challenging time is often easy as well. We feel their pain and want to help them



in their time of need. But how good are we when it comes to showing mercy to someone who has done us wrong or who has done wrong to others?

Being merciful means showing mercy when there is no chance the person will return the favor or acknowledge it. Jesus shows us there are ways to show mercy to others who have done wrong. The first thing is not to judge. When we judge, we jump to conclusions or assumptions without having the full picture. We also may be guilty of judging others by categorizing them. We act or make comments based on who their family is, their race, or even their heritage.

Along with judging, we should not condemn others. We make assumptions and then we condemn them by deciding the consequences. We may avoid them, not talk to them, or talk about them. If someone has sinned, it is not our job to condemn them. Often, they know what they have done and will have to ask for God's mercy.

To be merciful as our Father is merciful, we must show forgiveness repeatedly. Jesus called on us to forgive 70 times 7. Here at St Theresa, we want to be a church that sinners run to and find someone who extends grace and forgiveness.

Es más fácil decirlo que hacerlo. Por lo general, somos particularmente buenos mostrando misericordia a nuestros amigos y familiares; después de todo, ellos también la muestran de la misma manera. Mostrar misericordia a alguien que está pasando por un momento difícil también suele ser fácil. Sentimos su dolor

y queremos ayudarlos en su momento de necesidad. Pero, ¿qué tan buenos somos cuando se trata de mostrar misericordia a alguien que nos ha hecho mal o que ha hecho mal a otros?

Ser misericordioso significa mostrar misericordia cuando no hay posibilidad de que la persona le devuelva el favor o lo reconozca. Si alguien ha pecado, no es nuestro trabajo condenarlo. Muchas veces saben lo que han hecho y tendrán que pedir la misericordia de Dios.

Para ser misericordiosos como nuestro Padre es misericordioso, debemos mostrar perdón repetidamente. Jesús nos llamó a perdonar 70 veces 7. Aquí en Santa Teresa, queremos ser una iglesia a la que los pecadores acudan y encuentren a alguien que les extienda gracia y perdón.
