FROM FATHER TOM



Frank Sinatra was dining at an upscale restaurant in Los Angeles when he noticed a young waiter looking distressed. Sinatra, known for his sharp eye and ability to read people, observed the waiter speaking quietly with another staff member about

something clearly troubling him. The singer, always curious about the lives of those around him, called the young man over and casually asked, "What's on your mind, kid?"

Hesitant at first, the waiter admitted he was struggling to pay for his college tuition. His dream was to finish school and build a better future, but mounting costs had made it nearly impossible. He had taken extra shifts at the restaurant, working long hours just to stay afloat, yet it wasn't enough. Sinatra listened intently, nodding as the young man explained his situation.

After a brief pause, Sinatra pulled out his checkbook and asked, "How much do you owe?" The waiter, thinking it was just a friendly question, hesitated before giving him the number. Without another word, Sinatra wrote a check covering the entire amount. When the stunned waiter tried to refuse or offer some form of repayment, Sinatra simply slid the check across the table and said, "Just do something good for someone else someday."

Sinatra's reputation as a tough, no-nonsense personality often overshadowed his deep sense of loyalty and kindness. Those in his inner circle knew he had a soft spot for hardworking people trying to make something of themselves. He had spent his own youth in Hoboken, New Jersey, watching his parents struggle to make ends meet. Though he later achieved massive fame with hits like "Strangers in the Night" and "My Way," he never forgot the value of lending a hand to someone who needed it.

This wasn't an isolated incident. Throughout his life, Sinatra privately helped countless people, from struggling musicians to strangers he met by chance. On another occasion, he reportedly left a \$2,000 tip for a cab driver who had driven him across town late at night. Once, he paid off a struggling friend's mortgage without being asked. He even sent money anonymously to hospital patients and war veterans who had no idea where the funds came from.

Almsgiving It is one of the three practices of Lent - **Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving**. May the Lord touch our hearts to be kind and compassionate.

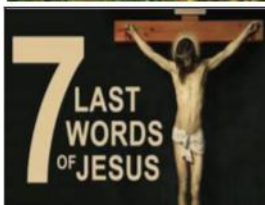

DEL PADRE TOM



Frank Sinatra cenaba en un restaurante de lujo de Los Ángeles cuando vio que un joven camarero parecía afligido. Sinatra, conocido por su aguda mirada y su capacidad para leer a las personas, observó que el camarero hablaba en voz baja con otro miembro del

personal sobre algo que claramente le preocupaba. El cantante, siempre curioso por la vida de los que le rodeaban, llamó al joven y le preguntó despreocupadamente: “¿Qué te preocupa, chico?”.

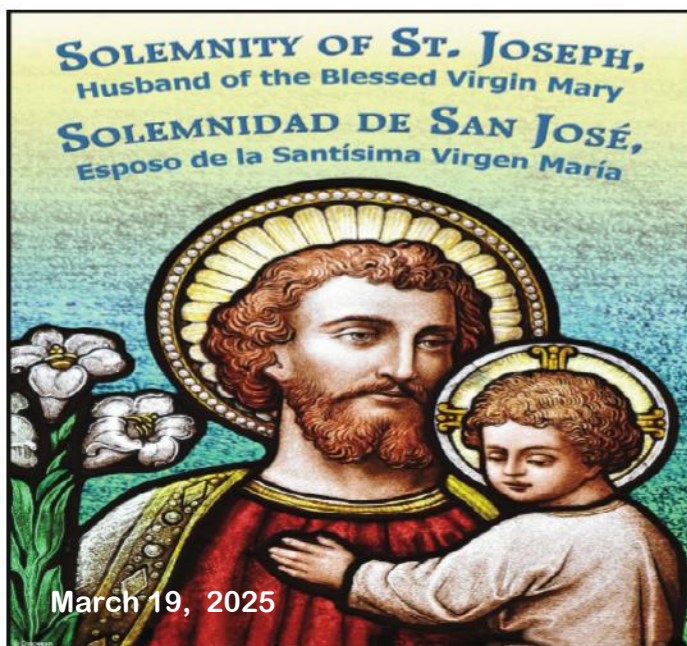
Vacilante al principio, el camarero admitió que estaba luchando por pagar la matrícula de la universidad. Su sueño era terminar los estudios y labrarse un futuro mejor, pero el aumento de los gastos lo hacía casi imposible. Había hecho turnos extra en el restaurante, trabajando muchas horas para mantenerse a flote, pero no era suficiente. Sinatra escuchó atentamente, asintiendo mientras el joven explicaba su situación.

Tras una breve pausa, Sinatra sacó su chequera y preguntó: “¿Cuánto debe?”. El camarero, pensando que sólo era una pregunta amistosa, dudó antes de darle la cifra. Sin mediar palabra, Sinatra extendió un cheque por el importe total. Cuando el atónito camarero intentó negarse u ofrecer alguna forma de reembolso, Sinatra simplemente deslizó el cheque por la mesa y dijo: “Algún día haz algo bueno por otra persona”.

La reputación de Sinatra como una personalidad dura y sensata a menudo eclipsaba su profundo sentido de la lealtad y la bondad. Sus allegados sabían que sentía debilidad por la gente trabajadora que intentaba salir adelante. Había pasado su juventud en Hoboken, Nueva Jersey, viendo a sus padres luchar para llegar a fin de mes. Aunque más tarde alcanzó la fama masiva con éxitos como “Strangers in the Night” y “My Way”, nunca olvidó el valor de echar una mano a quien lo necesitaba.

No fue un incidente aislado. A lo largo de su vida, Sinatra ayudó en privado a innumerables personas, desde músicos en apuros hasta desconocidos que conoció por casualidad. En otra ocasión, dejó una propina de 2.000 dólares a un taxista que le había llevado por la ciudad a altas horas de la noche. Una vez, pagó la hipoteca de un amigo en apuros sin que nadie se lo pidiera. Incluso envió dinero anónimamente a pacientes hospitalizados y veteranos de guerra que no sabían de dónde procedían los fondos. **Limosna** Es una de las tres prácticas de la Cuaresma: **oración, ayuno y limosna**. Que el Señor toque nuestros corazones para que seamos amables y compasivos.

It's a cold rainy morning and as I sit here thinking about my article for this week's bulletin, I'm enjoying the sound of the rain hitting outside my office window. I love that sound, although, truthfully, I'd love it best if I were home with a blanket on my lap, my feet up, Pendragon, my cat, asleep on my lap and reading an enjoyable book.



May he be like rain falling on a mown field, like showers watering the earth. Psalm 72:6

This line of the Psalm made me think how faith is like a mown field. A field that has been mown and maintained will get thick and lush with care and rain, while a field that is not maintained will grow thin. It's important that a field be mowed or pruned.

It's a lot like God. No, I don't think that God mows us down, but he does do a little pruning now and then. It's helpful to evaluate our lives now and then. As each new year starts, we may evaluate the batteries in the smoke detectors, look at our income and reevaluate our spending budget, and even make plans to renovate the house or lawn.

By the same means, we should evaluate ourselves and ask God to show us if there are things that may need pruning. Are we still carrying anger over a past relationship or incident? Or are we still blaming others for our own failures? Ask God to help you see those things that need pruning to get rid of those dead branches. We may be afraid to do that and discover what needs to be done to gain something new we don't yet understand. I know it may be uncomfortable to do this process, but the results may be amazing!

God is waiting on us to develop our relationship with him. He wants us to help us to let go of the heavy load. God wants us to be rooted in his love so that we can bear good fruit, and he can help us through the more turbulent times. Just remember, what we get may not be what we thought, but it will be for the best and it will be done in God's time, not ours.

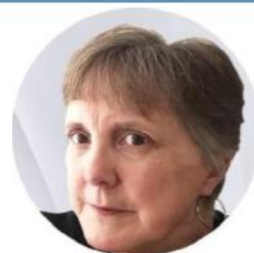

Have Faith

The story of the **Transfiguration of Jesus** in the Luke's Gospel this week is similar to the ones in Matthew and Mark. One difference I noticed in Luke's version is that Jesus does not tell the three disciples to keep it secret. It seems they decided on their own not to tell anyone.

One reason may be what they heard. While Matthew and Mark just say that Jesus spoke with Moses and Elijah, Luke is more specific: They "spoke of his exodus that he was going to accomplish in Jerusalem" (9:31). Jesus had just said that he would suffer, die, and be raised from the dead in Luke 9:22. They probably hoped he was just telling them the worst that could happen, not what really would happen. So hearing it from Moses and Elijah as well as from Jesus was too much for them.

This is where we come in. The apostles were afraid to face the coming passion and death of Jesus. I think we are like them in that we suffer more in anticipating what would hurt us than we do going through it. That is where faith can help. In faith, we hear Jesus tell us not to fear, as he often told his disciples. We know that Jesus suffered on the cross, so he knows what suffering is. And faith tells us that he is with us even when the suffering is the result of our own sins. After all, he himself suffered because of our sins.
