





When Your Phone Call Turns into a Circus 🎪

My Take



Recently Tom and I watched a special on Yosemite which explained the history of how it became a national park. In 1903, President Theodore Roosevelt visited Yosemite and was guided by naturalist John Muir. The two men spent three memorable nights camping, first under the outstretched arms of the Grizzly Giant in the Mariposa Grove of Giant Sequoias. The Grizzly Giant is leaning slightly, about 5 degrees southward now. But there is not much concern over the tree falling over. Sequoias have a shallow root system that extends a considerable distance, intertwining with other trees for support. By intertwining the roots, the trees form a network of stability and support.

Our faith is like the roots of the Sequoias. Just as the tree roots absorb water and nutrients, we absorb God’s Words for spiritual nourishment and stability. As we grow spiritually, we bear fruit. If we root ourselves into God’s words, we do not need to fear. God will always give us the everlasting water to sustain us.

Trees have different kinds of roots: aerial roots which grow above ground and are not very efficient at absorbing moisture or supporting themselves. Surface root trees grow a few feet deep. The roots can represent the beginning connections to God. Taproots, as the Sequoias have, means your faith has very deep roots. You pray to God daily and study his Word. The deeper the roots, the stronger you become.

If a Sequoia becomes sick, the other trees send nutrients through the root system, helping to nourish it back to health. The trees must all work to get their nourishment. Our faith, too, takes effort and diligence. We can just scrape by with the nourishment from the Sunday Gospel or we can develop a closer relationship with God and receive help to overcome sin and produce fruit. Decide to develop the deeper roots and keep your heart rooted in God and you won’t be moved.

Mí opinión



Recientemente, Tom y yo vimos un especial sobre Yosemite que explicaba la historia de cómo se convirtió en parque nacional. En 1903, el presidente Theodore Roosevelt visitó Yosemite bajo la guía del naturalista John Muir. Los dos hombres pasaron tres noches memorables acampando, primero bajo los brazos extendidos del Gigante Grizzly en el Bosque Mariposa de Sequoias Gigantes. El Gigante Grizzly se inclina ligeramente, unos 5 grados hacia el sur. Pero no hay mucha preocupación por la caída del árbol. Las secuías tienen un sistema de raíces poco profundas que se extiende a una distancia considerable, entrelazándose con otros árboles para sostenerse. Al entrelazar las raíces, los árboles forman una red de estabilidad y apoyo.

Nuestra fe es como las raíces de las secuías. Así como las raíces de los árboles absorben agua y nutrientes, nosotros absorbemos la Palabra de Dios para obtener alimento y estabilidad espiritual. A medida que crecemos espiritualmente, damos fruto. Si nos arraigamos en la palabra de Dios, no tenemos por qué temer. Dios siempre nos dará el agua eterna para sustentarnos.

Los árboles tienen diferentes tipos de raíces: raíces aéreas que crecen por encima del suelo y no son muy eficientes para absorber la humedad ni sostenerse. Los árboles con raíces superficiales crecen a pocos metros de profundidad. Las raíces pueden representar la conexión inicial con Dios. Las raíces pivotantes, como las de las secuías, significan que tu fe tiene raíces muy profundas. Oras a Dios a diario y estudias su Palabra. Cuanto más profundas sean las raíces, más fuerte te vuelves.

Si una secuía se enferma, los demás árboles envían nutrientes a través del sistema radicular, ayudándola a recuperar su salud. Todos los árboles deben trabajar para obtener su alimento. Nuestra fe también requiere esfuerzo y diligencia. Podemos sobrevivir con el alimento del Evangelio dominical o podemos desarrollar una relación más cercana con Dios y recibir ayuda para vencer el pecado y dar fruto. Decide cultivar raíces más profundas y mantener tu corazón arraigado en Dios, y no te conmovrás.


