

POPE LEO XIV

1975: This man made a shocking decision: He rejected Harvard Law to serve Peru's poorest villages
Now, he's the 267th Pope

- Speaks ancient Incan
- Walked 8 hrs to help the poor
- First American born ever

In 1975, Robert Prevost was at the top of his game. Chicago math teacher. Devout Catholic. Accepted into Harvard Law. He had everything a young man could dream of, but then—he made a decision that no one saw coming. He said no to Harvard, no to a six-figure future. No to fame. No to comfort.

And yes—to something few dare to choose: A life of complete surrender. He joined a missionary group and moved to Peru. Not to the cities. Not to the tourist spots.

But to the *most* remote villages—where children die from treatable diseases. And families walk miles just for clean water. There were no roads. No running water. No WiFi

Just mountains. Silence And poverty. But he embraced it like home, Robert didn't just live *among* the people. He became *one* of them

- Learned Quechua—the sacred language of the Incas
- Carried food on foot for days
- Slept on dirt floors with the villagers
- Prayed under the stars
- When he wasn't building shelters, he taught math to barefoot kids under broken rooftops.

When he wasn't teaching, he carried the sick on donkeys to get help. When he wasn't healing, he listened—truly listened—to stories no one else cared to hear.

While his friends from back home became lawyers and doctors he became something else entirely.

- A shepherd
 - A brother
 - A quiet warrior of faith
- And slowly—his legend grew. His acts weren't broadcasted, but they echoed through the Andes

Bishops noticed
Priests noticed
And eventually—the Vatican noticed
They called him back to lead his entire Augustinian order.
From serving a village. To overseeing 2,800 brothers in over 40 countries.
Still—he kept his same sandals
Still—he walked with the poor
Still—he rejected luxury

Then came the call that changed everything.

Rome wanted him closer. In 2020, he was appointed Archbishop and assigned to govern other bishops globally. It was rare. But Robert had never chased tradition. He wasn't just fluent in Latin or Canon Law.

He was fluent in *compassion*

- In humility
- In listening
- In *presence*

The Vatican didn't just see a priest. They saw a *leader with soul*. On September 30, 2023. Pope Francis made it official: Robert Prevost was named a Cardinal.
Just one step below the Pope

And then... in **2025**
History was made. For the first time ever ...
An American
A former math teacher
A missionary to the forgotten

was elevated as the 267th Pope of the Catholic Church

And he didn't forget the people who shaped him. To this day. Pope Robert still returns to the same villages.
Still prays in Quechua
Still sits on dirt floors
Still holds the hands of the elderly in silence

Because leadership he believes is about *presence* not position

The world is obsessed with power. But Robert Prevost proves:
• Titles mean nothing without service
• Knowledge is useless without love
• And faith—without sacrifice—is noise
He turned down the world. And changed it instead.

PAPA LEO XIV

- **1975:** Este hombre tomó una decisión impactante: Rechazó las leyes de Harvard para servir a los pueblos más pobres de Perú.
- Ahora, es el 267° Papa.
- Habla inca antiguo
- Caminó 8 horas para ayudar a los pobres
- El primer estadounidense nacido

En 1975, Robert Prevost estaba en la cima de su carrera. Profesor de matemáticas en Chicago. Católico devoto. Aceptado en Derecho en Harvard. Tenía todo lo que un joven puede soñar, pero entonces tomó una decisión que nadie vio venir. Dijo no a Harvard, no a un futuro de seis cifras. No a la fama. No a la comodidad.

Y sí a algo que pocos se atreven a elegir: Una vida de entrega total. Se unió a un grupo misionero y se trasladó a Perú. No a las ciudades. No a los lugares turísticos. Sino a los pueblos *más* remotos, donde los niños mueren de enfermedades tratables. Y las familias caminan kilómetros sólo para conseguir agua potable. No había carreteras. Ni agua corriente. Ni WiFi.

Sólo montañas. Silencio y pobreza. Pero él lo acogió como si fuera su casa, Robert no se limitó a vivir *entre* la gente. Se convirtió en uno de ellos.
- Aprendió quechua, la lengua sagrada de los incas.
Llevó comida a pie durante días.
Durmió en suelos de tierra con los aldeanos.
Rezaba bajo las estrellas
Cuando no estaba construyendo refugios, enseñaba matemáticas a niños descalzos bajo tejados rotos.

Cuando no estaba enseñando, llevaba a los enfermos en burros para conseguir ayuda. Cuando no curaba, escuchaba - escuchaba de verdad- historias que nadie más quería oír.

Mientras sus amigos se convertían en abogados y médicos, él se dedicaba a otra cosa.
Pastor
Un hermano
Un guerrero silencioso de la fe
Y poco a poco su leyenda creció. Sus actos no fueron difundidos, pero resonaron en los Andes.

Los obispos se dieron cuenta
Los sacerdotes se dieron cuenta
Y finalmente, el Vaticano se dio cuenta.
Lo llamaron para que volviera a dirigir toda su orden agustiniana.
De servir a un pueblo. A supervisar a 2.800 hermanos en más de 40 países.
Aún así, mantuvo sus mismas sandalias
Siguió caminando con los pobres
Rechazó el lujo

Entonces llegó la llamada que lo cambió todo.

Roma le quería más cerca. En 2020, fue nombrado arzobispo y asignado a gobernar a otros obispos en todo el mundo. Era raro. Pero Robert nunca había perseguido la tradición. No sólo dominaba el latín o el Derecho Canónico.

Él era fluido en *compasión*
En humildad
En escuchar
En *presencia*

El Vaticano no sólo vio a un sacerdote. Vieron un *líder con alma*. El 30 de septiembre de 2023. El Papa Francisco lo hizo oficial: Robert Prevost fue nombrado Cardenal.

Sólo un escalón por debajo del Papa.
Y entonces... en 2025

Se hizo historia. Por primera vez en la historia...

Un americano
Un antiguo profesor de matemáticas
Un misionero de los olvidados
fue elevado como el 267° Papa de la Iglesia Católica

Y no olvidó a las personas que lo formaron. A día de hoy. El Papa Roberto sigue volviendo a los mismos pueblos.

Sigue rezando en quechua
Sigue sentándose en suelos de tierra
Sigue cogiendo las manos de los ancianos en silencio

Porque cree que el liderazgo se basa en la *presencia*, no en la posición.


El mundo está obsesionado con el poder.

My Take



Unfortunately, I was out of town and didn't get to celebrate the 100th anniversary of the canonization of St Therese on May 17th. I remembered a book of Father Tom's which I read several years ago titled "Stronger Than Steel, Soldiers of the Great War write to St Therese of Lisieux." It's a fascinating book with actual letters from French soldiers thanking St Therese for answering their prayers during their time at the front. What makes it so fascinating is that St Therese died 17 years earlier, but that didn't stop her from protecting them, appearing to them, giving peace with the smell of roses, and even taking some by the hand to safety. Every letter is emotional with description of time on the front, huddled in trenches, being hit by bullets, and seeing many friends killed right alongside them.

I was especially touched by one letter from Le Denen which he wrote asking his loved one not to say, "Those bad Germans." He states that God loves the Germans just as much as he loves us, and he did not create one race inferior to another. We should heed Le Denen's words and remember that not all groups or races are any better or inferior to others. We must treat each other with respect and love. Le Denen wrote that he heard a voice in his head saying, "Return good for evil, be better than they are." Good words to live by.

In celebration of the 100th anniversary of St Therese's Canonization and the Jubilee Year, relics of St Therese will be visiting the United States from October 1st to December 8th, 2025. The closest location will be in the Diocese of Miami from December 1-8, 2025. Specific dates and locations can be found here: <https://stthereseusa2025.com/schedule-of-events>.

As St Therese stated on her deathbed "I will spend my heaven doing good on earth" and she held up to her words. Not only to those French soldiers but to countless others around the world who call on her for help, St Therese has not forgotten any of us.




Lamentablemente, estaba fuera de la ciudad y no pude celebrar el centenario de la canonización de Santa Teresita el 17 de mayo. Recordé un libro del Padre Tom que leí hace varios años titulado "Más fuertes que el acero, los soldados de la Gran Guerra escriben a Santa Teresita de Lisieux". Es un libro fascinante con cartas reales de soldados franceses agradeciendo a Santa Teresita por responder a sus oraciones durante su tiempo en el frente. Lo que lo hace tan fascinante es que Santa Teresita murió 17 años antes, pero eso no le impidió protegerlos, aparecerse ante ellos, darles paz con aroma a rosas e incluso llevar a algunos de la mano a un lugar seguro. Cada carta es emotiva, con descripciones del tiempo en el frente, apiñados en trincheras, siendo alcanzados por balas y viendo a muchos amigos morir junto a ellos.

Me conmovió especialmente una carta de Le Denen, en la que le pedía a su ser querido que no dijera: "Esos malos alemanes". Afirma que Dios ama a los alemanes tanto como a nosotros, y que no creó una raza inferior a otra. Debemos prestar atención a las palabras de Le Denen y recordar que no todos los grupos o razas son mejores ni inferiores a otros. Debemos tratarnos con respeto y amor. Le Denen escribió que escuchó una voz interior que le decía: «Devuelve bien por mal, sé mejor que ellos». Buenas palabras para vivir.

Para celebrar el centenario de la canonización de Santa Teresita y el Año Jubilar, las reliquias de Santa Teresita visitarán Estados Unidos del 1 de octubre al 8 de diciembre de 2025. 


