

FROM FATHER TOM



5 Important Moments Catholics Should Make the Sign of the Cross

When we make the Sign of the Cross, we remember that God is One and Triune. It is a simple and effective way for us, as Catholics, to affirm our faith. The gesture is made at the beginning and end of the Holy Mass, but here are

some important moments in which you can make the Sign of the Cross:

- 1. *In personal prayer*: As Cardinal Ratzinger (future Pope Benedict XVI) once stated, "The most basic Christian gesture in prayer is and always will be the Sign of the Cross." Therefore, invoking the Holy Trinity opens our hearts to hear God in prayer and also drives away demons.
- 1. When passing a church: The biographers of Saint Francis of Assisi said that whenever he saw a church, he would kneel. Wherever he was, he said a short prayer. Sometimes, in the rush of daily life, going to work or some appointment, we pass by a church and don't pay attention to the great miracle of Jesus truly present body, blood, soul, and divinity. Therefore, if it is impossible to stop and pay a visit, a beautiful gesture of piety is to make the sign of the Cross to honor the Blessed Sacrament that is present there.
- 2. **When hearing a siren**: Whether through an ambulance or firefighters, make this gesture as a way of interceding for someone who may be in danger of death, and so that the professionals involved can do a good job. If you can, also say a Hail Mary for the situation and the people involved.
- 3. **When passing by a cemetery**: The word "cemetery" comes from the Greek word "Koimeterion," which means "resting place." Therefore, this is a beautiful way to honor and pray for the holy souls whose bodies rest there.
- 4. *In the event of an accident*: Just like when you hear a siren, you can pray for the dead and/or injured when you pass an accident, and intercede for the victims and rescue workers.
- 5. What would you add to the list? As St Paul encourages us to pray always, **making the sign of the cross is a simple, easy way to pray**. Let's make it our pious habit.

5 momentos importantes en los que los católicos deben persignarse

Cuando nos persignamos, recordamos que Dios es Uno y Trino. Es una forma sencilla y eficaz de afirmar nuestra fe como católicos. El gesto se hace al principio y al final de la Santa Misa, pero aquí hay algunos momentos importantes en los

que usted puede hacer la Señal de la Cruz :

- 1. **En la oración personal**: Como afirmó en una ocasión el Cardenal Ratzinger (futuro Papa Benedicto XVI), «El gesto cristiano más básico en la oración es y será siempre la Señal de la Cruz.» Por lo tanto, invocar a la Santísima Trinidad abre nuestros corazones para escuchar a Dios en la oración y también ahuyenta a los demonios.
- 2. Al pasar por delante de una iglesia: Los biógrafos de San Francisco de Asís cuentan que siempre que veía una iglesia, se arrodillaba. Dondequiera que estuviera, rezaba una breve oración. A veces, en el ajetreo de la vida cotidiana, yendo al trabajo o a alguna cita, pasamos por delante de una iglesia y no prestamos atención al gran milagro de Jesús realmente presente cuerpo, sangre, alma y divinidad. Por eso, si es imposible detenerse a hacer una visita, un hermoso gesto de piedad es hacer la señal de la Cruz para honrar al Santísimo Sacramento allí presente.
- 3. **Al oír una sirena**: Ya sea a través de una ambulancia o de los bomberos, haz este gesto como una forma de interceder por alguien que puede estar en peligro de muerte, y para que los profesionales que intervienen puedan hacer un buen trabajo. Si puedes, reza también un Ave María por la situación y las personas implicadas.
- 4. **Al pasar por un cementerio**: La palabra «cementerio» viene del griego «Koimeterion», que significa «lugar de descanso». Por lo tanto, ésta es una hermosa manera de honrar y rezar por las almas santas cuyos cuerpos descansan allí.
- 5. **En caso de accidente**: Al igual que cuando oyes una sirena, puedes rezar por los muertos y/o heridos cuando pases por un accidente, e interceder por las víctimas y los socorristas.

¿Qué añadirías a la lista? Como San Pablo nos anima a rezar siempre, hacer la señal de la cruz es una forma sencilla y fácil de rezar. Hagamos de ella nuestra piadosa costumbre.





Dear brothers and sisters discerning the call of God,


It is certainly an act of faith to open that door. Opening the door to Jesus means change and change is scary. It also means admitting the Lord knows more about what will make us happy than we do.
