

FROM FATHER TOM CONCLAVE OVERVIEW

The process for selecting the successor to St. Peter has varied over the years, but the basics of the current system have been around for about 500 years. A future pope is elected by eligible cardinals (there are currently 135), all of whom must be under the age of 80. The number and nature of the electors -- as well as the lack of campaigning -- distinguish a conclave from any sort of political election.



Church law stipulates that conclaves normally start 15 days after a pope dies, but can start earlier if all electors are present or be delayed to the 20 day mark, if need be.

The conclave is preceded by a Mass in St. Peter's asking the Holy Spirit for guidance in the selection of the next pope. Once the cardinals have entered the Sistine Chapel, the conclave proper begins with the Master of Ceremonies expelling all those who will not participate in the voting for the conclave from the Chapel. The doors of the Chapel are then locked (*cum clave*). "Cum Clave" is the origin of the word "conclave." A two-thirds majority is needed for a successor to be chosen; therefore, there is often a number of votes until this result is achieved.

It can take many days before a new pope is elected, during which the public knows little about what is occurring. This is meant to be an opportunity for the cardinals to gather without other influences or distractions. Cardinals must be physically present at the conclave in Rome to cast ballots. During the conclave, the cardinals live in the Domus Sanctae Marthae, a hotel-like facility next to St. Peter's Basilica. It's where Pope Francis opted to live, rather than in the Apostolic Palace's papal apartments. The residence has been compared to a three-star hotel.

The first round is merely an indication of the cardinals' priorities. On the following day, the conclave starts holding two rounds of voting each morning, and another two in the afternoon. After each vote, a needle is pushed through the ballots, binding them together. If no winner emerges with a two-thirds majority, the two packages are "put together in that stove that is in the corner of the Sistine Chapel, to burn them and produce whatever smoke needs to be produced — white "we have a pope" or black, "no pope."

After a successful vote, the winning candidate is asked two questions. The first is whether they accept their election as pope. The second question is going to be, 'What name do you choose?' Then the name is chosen. Official documents are filled out, and the new pope is taken into a sacristy, to be fitted with papal attire. There are typically three sets of vestments ready, in sizes roughly equal to small, medium and large. Soon afterward, the senior cardinal deacon will appear on the balcony over St. Peter's Square, announcing, *Habemus Papam!* — "We have a pope!" It will then be the new pope's turn to emerge onto the balcony and deliver his first blessing.

Pray for the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

DEL PADRE TOM VISIÓN GENERAL DEL CÓNCLAVE



El proceso de selección del sucesor de San Pedro ha variado a lo largo de los años, pero los fundamentos del sistema actual existen desde hace unos 500 años. El futuro Papa es elegido por los cardenales elegibles (actualmente hay 135), todos los cuales deben tener menos de 80 años. El número y la naturaleza de los electores, así como la ausencia de campaña electoral, distinguen un cónclave de cualquier tipo de elección política. La ley de la Iglesia estipula que los cónclaves comienzan normalmente 15 días después de la muerte de un Papa, pero pueden empezar antes si todos los electores están presentes o retrasarse hasta los 20 días, si es necesario.

El cónclave va precedido de una misa en San Pedro en la que se pide al Espíritu Santo que guíe la elección del próximo Papa. Una vez que los cardenales han entrado en la Capilla Sixtina, el cónclave propiamente dicho comienza con la expulsión de la Capilla por parte del Maestro de Ceremonias de todos aquellos que no participarán en la votación del cónclave. A continuación se cierran las puertas de la Capilla (cum clave). «Cum Clave» es el origen de la palabra “cónclave”. Se necesita una mayoría de dos tercios para que se elija a un sucesor; por lo tanto, suele haber varias votaciones hasta que se alcanza este resultado.

Pueden pasar muchos días antes de que se elija a un nuevo Papa, durante los cuales el público sabe poco de lo que está ocurriendo. Esto supone una oportunidad para que los cardenales se reúnan sin otras influencias o distracciones. Los cardenales deben estar físicamente presentes en el cónclave de Roma para emitir su voto. Durante el cónclave, los cardenales viven en la Domus Sanctae Marthae, una instalación similar a un hotel junto a la Basílica de San Pedro. Es donde el Papa Francisco ha optado por vivir, en lugar de hacerlo en los apartamentos papales del Palacio Apostólico. La residencia ha sido comparada con un hotel de tres estrellas.

La primera ronda no es más que una indicación de las prioridades de los cardenales. Al día siguiente, el cónclave inicia dos rondas de votaciones por la mañana y otras dos por la tarde. Después de cada votación, una aguja atraviesa las papeletas, uniéndolas. Si no surge ningún ganador con una mayoría de dos tercios, los dos paquetes se «juntan en esa estufa que está en la esquina de la Capilla Sixtina, para quemarlos y producir el humo que haya que producir: blanco “tenemos papa” o negro, “no hay papa”.

Tras una votación exitosa, al candidato ganador se le hacen dos preguntas. La primera es si aceptan su elección como papa. La segunda pregunta será: «¿Qué nombre eliges?». Entonces se elige el nombre. Se llenan los documentos oficiales, y el nuevo Papa es conducido a una sacristía, para vestirle con el atuendo papal. Normalmente se preparan tres conjuntos de vestiduras, en tallas aproximadamente iguales a la pequeña, mediana y grande. Poco después, el cardenal diácono mayor aparecerá en el balcón de la plaza de San Pedro y anunciará: «¡Habemus Papam! - ¡Tenemos un Papa!» Será entonces el turno del nuevo Papa de salir al balcón y pronunciar su primera bendición. ***Oremos para que el Espíritu Santo nos guíe.***






