FROM FATHER TOM



On September 7, 1774, the Continental Congress held its first official meeting at Carpenter's Hall in Philadelphia. Their first official act was prayer. And it wasn't some perfunctory prayer that was nothing more than protocol; it was a good old-fashioned prayer meeting. Our founding fathers prayed with fervency and intensity. Eyewitnesses said Henry, Randolph, Rutledge, Lee, and Jay were doubled over as they bowed in reverence before God. John Adams

Jay were doubled over as they bowed in reverence before God. John Adams later recounted that it "has had an excellent effect upon everybody here." And not surprisingly, General George Washington ended up on his knees. These revolutionaries knew their cause was doomed to fail without divine intervention. They prayed like it depended on God because they knew it did.

As we prepare to celebrate our country's birthday, let's not forget what fueled their courage. They were people of prayer. Nothing has changed in the last 248 years. We need prayer. Our country needs prayer. We have to return to our roots. In God we trust just can't be a pious slogan. Prayer can lead to a greater trust in God.

Celebrate this great event. I conclude with a prayer by our first president, George Washington.

"Almighty God: We make our earnest prayer that Thou wilt keep the United States in Thy holy protection; that thou wilt incline the hearts of the citizens to cultivate a spirit of subordination and obedience to government, and entertain a brotherly affection and love for one another and for their fellow-citizens of the United States at large. And finally that Thou wilt most graciously be pleased to dispose us all to do justice, to love mercy and to demean ourselves with that charity, humility and pacific temper of mind which were the characteristics of the Divine Author of our blessed religion without a humble imitation of whose example in these things we can never hope to be a happy nation. Grant our supplication, we beseech Thee, through Jesus Christ, our Lord. Amen."

DEL PADRE TOM

El 7 de septiembre de 1774, el Congreso Continental celebró su primera reunión oficial en el Carpenter's Hall de Filadelfia. Su primer acto oficial fue la oración. Y no se trató de una oración superficial que no fuera más que un protocolo, sino de una buena reunión de oración a la antigua usanza. Nuestros padres fundadores rezaron con fervor e intensidad. Testigos presenciales dijeron que

Henry, Randolph, Rutledge, Lee y Jay se inclinaron con reverencia ante Dios. John Adams relató más tarde que «tuvo un efecto excelente en todos los presentes». Y, como era de esperar, el general George Washington terminó de rodillas. Estos

revolucionarios sabían que su causa estaba condenada al fracaso sin la intervención divina. Oraron como si todo dependiera de Dios porque sabían que así era.

Mientras nos preparamos para celebrar el cumpleaños de nuestro país, no olvidemos lo que alimentó su valor. Eran personas de oración. Nada ha cambiado en los últimos 248 años. Necesitamos la oración. Nuestro país necesita la oración. Tenemos que volver a nuestras raíces. «En Dios confiamos» no puede ser solo un lema piadoso. La oración puede conducir a una mayor confianza en Dios.

Celebremos este gran acontecimiento. Concluyo con una oración de nuestro primer presidente, George Washington.

«Dios Todopoderoso: Te rogamos encarecidamente que mantengas a los Estados Unidos bajo Tu santa protección; que inclines los corazones de los ciudadanos a cultivar un espíritu de subordinación y obediencia al gobierno, y a sentir un afecto fraternal y amor por los demás y por sus conciudadanos de los Estados Unidos en general. Y, por último, que te complazcas en disponernos a todos a hacer justicia, a amar la misericordia y a comportarnos con la caridad, la humildad y el temperamento pacífico que caracterizaban al Divino Autor de nuestra bendita religión, sin cuya humilde imitación en estas cosas nunca podremos aspirar a ser una nación feliz. Concede nuestra súplica, te lo suplicamos, por Jesucristo, nuestro Señor. Amén».

Saints Peter and Paul, Apostles KEY TO THE CITY

Sometimes a mayor presents the key to the city to a citizen who has given outstanding service to the community. When Jesus gives Simon the keys to the kingdom of heaven, it is more than just a symbolic honor bestowed by a mayor. Jesus is actually giving both a blessing and a responsibility.

The blessing is that Peter recognized Jesus as the Son of God. Even today, people are blessed with this kind of faith. An atheist who has heard of Jesus but regards him as just another holy man may receive the faith to see that Jesus is the Son of God. A sick person may see that Jesus is with her in her suffering and begin to have hope. The faith that sees Jesus in others is the rock on which Jesus builds his church.

The responsibility comes in the binding and loosing. One meaning of this is the power that Jesus gives his church to forgive sins. So those who follow Jesus have that same obligation to forgive others. If we forgive those who hurt us, they may come to see God's love in us and know that God forgives them, too. So why pass up an opportunity to show God's love by forgiving someone? All Christians pray in the Lord's Prayer that we may be forgiven as we forgive others.
