## My Take

When Tom and I moved to FI, my friends from VA would often ask how I could give up a corporate job in DC and work for a Catholic Church? Do I make the same money? Not even close. For one, pay in the north is higher and so is the cost of living. When I was offered this job, my husband and I found a way to make it work.



I found this job by God's planning. I recently lost my last job because of a management takeover. I was looking at the newspaper and there was the ad for St Theresa. At first, I dismissed it, but then my mind kept going back to it. Could I do this job? What did I know about the running of a Catholic Church?

The biggest challenge coming to St Theresa was to change my mindset from the corporate world to the church. I was viewing everything from the HR lens that I had spent my past 25 years perfecting. That is not necessarily a bad thing since this is good knowledge to keep the church in compliance with state and federal laws.

My shortcoming was in my spiritual leadership. I was sometimes applying too much HR and not enough spiritual understanding of how to help others. I am always working on this, and my goal became to not direct people, but to inspire them. I want to develop others and myself to understand where God wants us to be and how to use God's methods to get us there. To do this, my first step was to become comfortable in praising God to others without feeling shy or unworthy. I needed to practice praying in front of others instead of hiding behind those who do it so well already. I sometimes do this now, but it still causes me some anxiety. I need to get past it because God knows what I am trying to say and everyone encourages the attempt.

After seven years, I found that changing that mindset is entirely possible. I have found that using my gifts and abilities for St Theresa have been worthwhile and fulfilling. I am wondering why I did not do this sooner.

## Mí opíníon

Cuando Tom y yo nos mudamos a Florida, mis amigos de Virginia solían preguntarme cómo podía dejar un trabajo corporativo en Washington D. C. y trabajar en una iglesia católica. ¿Ganaría lo mismo? Ni de cerca. Para empezar, los salarios en el norte son más altos, al igual que el costo de vida. Cuando me ofrecieron este trabajo, mi esposo y yo encontramos la manera de que funcionara.



Encontré este trabajo por designio divino. Recientemente perdí mi último trabajo debido a una adquisición de la gerencia. Estaba mirando el periódico y vi el anuncio de Santa Teresa. Al principio lo descarté, pero luego volvía a él una y otra vez. ¿Podría hacer este trabajo? ¿Qué sabía yo sobre el funcionamiento de una iglesia católica?

El mayor desafío al llegar a Santa Teresa fue cambiar mi mentalidad, del mundo corporativo a la iglesia. Lo veía todo desde la perspectiva de recursos humanos, que había perfeccionado durante los últimos 25 años. Esto no es necesariamente malo, ya que es un conocimiento útil para que la iglesia cumpla con las leyes estatales y federales.

Mi deficiencia residía en mi liderazgo espiritual. A veces aplicaba demasiado recursos humanos y no suficiente comprensión espiritual sobre cómo ayudar a los demás. Siempre estoy trabajando en esto, y mi objetivo pasó a ser inspirar a las personas, no dirigirlas. Quiero ayudar a otros y a mí mismo a comprender dónde quiere Dios que estemos y cómo usar sus métodos para llegar allí. Para lograrlo, mi primer paso fue sentirme cómodo al alabar a Dios a los demás sin sentirme tímido ni indigno. Necesitaba practicar la oración delante de otros en lugar de esconderme detrás de quienes ya lo hacen tan bien. A veces lo hago ahora, pero todavía me causa algo de ansiedad. Necesito superarlo porque Dios sabe lo que intento decir y todos me animan a intentarlo.

Después de siete años, descubrí que cambiar esa mentalidad es totalmente posible. He descubierto que usar mis dones y habilidades para Santa Teresa ha valido la pena y me ha sido gratificante. Me pregunto por qué no lo hice antes.

#### Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time FALSE HUMILITY?

There seems to be a lot of rejoicing in today's readings. Isaiah talks about rejoicing with Jerusalem. The Gospel shows the disciples rejoicing when they came back from visiting towns to tell about the Kingdom. St. Paul is happy to be suffering for Christ. So what is the reason for such joy?

The readings make clear that it is not a result of our efforts. Isaiah writes that "the Lord's power shall be known to his servants" (Isaiah 66:14). Jesus tells his disciples not to rejoice that they cast out demons, but "because your names are written in heaven" (Luke 10:20). In other words, we are to rejoice over all the Lord has done for us, not what we have done for him.

Does that sound like false humility? No; when we do anything for others, we can honestly say that God does the real work. Knowing that frees us from expecting everyone to be happy, everything we do for others to be successful. Instead of being discouraged when we seem to fail, we can trust that God's plan is working in ways we just can't see.

St. Paul has a similar theme in the second reading. You would think he would be proud of all the converts he made, or the people he cured. He boasts only about his suffering because that is how he is most like Jesus. He sees all of his accomplishments as the work of God. All three readings remind us that what changes our lives and changes the world is not how hard we work, or how holy we are; what really makes the difference is how much God loves us. That is the real reason to rejoice. —-
