

### FROM FATHER TOM

I was nervous. I attended an ALPHA conference (we offer ALPHA here at St Theresa) in late July in picturesque Tennessee. On Wednesday evening, they offered a free dinner for pastors and their spouses (we were a mixed group obviously). Hey, free dinner! I'm game. Admittedly, when Wednesday came I had second thoughts. Dinner time and I did not know anyone. I was the only priest until Fr. Joe Kim arrived halfway through

dinner. I look around. Whom can I latch on to? There was a couple standing alone so I ventured over to them. The conversation fell flat. I spotted this volunteer whom I met earlier this morning. He is from my old neighborhood in Long Island City. I checked in with him but he had work to do.

Finally, time to eat. I grab my plate and filled my plate. Now where to sit? I slip over to this table. Four people were already in conversation. I sit and was about to introduce myself but they never looked my way. They just kept talking. I leaned forward trying to hear, looking for an opening. Eventually they noticed me. That ended quickly as they went back to their conversation. I threw in a word or two hoping to be part of the group. I was an outsider. Thankfully our host called our attention and shared his testimony. Great, I thought. Almost time to leave.

I imagine we all have been there. You go to a gathering and you do not know a soul. You try to mix and it just doesn't work. You ask yourself why did I come? You can't wait until it is over. What made it worse was that it took place at the ALPHA conference. Hospitality is one of their major values. ALPHA is built on making guests feel welcome and wanted.

Unfortunately we compartmentalize. When at church we act a certain way, outside of church, not so much. My table mates did not have to engage with me. I served them no purpose. I was not going to join their church. I was not a recognized church person. They did not have to go out of their way for me. Most likely we will never see each other again.

We can't let that happen here. Whenever we gather, put up your radar. Look for the person who is alone. Invite them to your table or you and your group sit with them. Though you may be with your friends and really want to enjoy their company, don't make that a priority. Put the other person first. Introduce yourself. Start off with a general conversation. In time you will probably break into smaller conversations. That is fine. Just make sure that no one is left out.

Please have a heart for the outsider. I have been there and I am sure you have as well. It is no fun. Let's do our best to make everyone feel at home here at St. Theresa.

### **DEL PADRE TOM**

Estaba nervioso. Asistí a una conferencia ALPHA (aquí en St. Theresa ofrecemos ALPHA) a finales de julio en la pintoresca Tennessee. El miércoles por la noche, ofrecieron una cena gratuita para los pastores y sus cónyuges (obviamente, éramos un grupo mixto). ¡Oye, cena gratis! Me apunto. Hay que reconocer que, cuando llegó el miércoles, tuve dudas. Era la hora de la cena y no conocía a nadie. Yo era el único sacerdote hasta que llegó el padre Joe Kim a mitad de la cena. Miré a mi alrededor. ¿A quién podía unirme? Había

una pareja sola, así que me acerqué a ellos. La conversación no fluyó. Vi a un voluntario que había conocido esa misma mañana. Era de mi antiguo barrio en Long Island City. Me acerqué a él, pero tenía trabajo que hacer.

Por fin, llegó la hora de comer. Cogí mi plato y lo llené. Ahora, ¿dónde sentarme? Me acerqué a una mesa. Cuatro personas ya estaban conversando. Me senté y estaba a punto de presentarme, pero no me miraron. Simplemente siguieron hablando. Me incliné hacia delante para intentar escuchar, buscando una oportunidad. Finalmente se fijaron en mí. Eso terminó rápidamente, ya que volvieron a su conversación. Dije un par de palabras con la esperanza de formar parte del grupo. Era un extraño. Afortunadamente, nuestro anfitrión nos llamó la atención y compartió su testimonio. Genial, pensé. Ya casi es hora de irse.

Imagino que todos hemos pasado por eso. Vas a una reunión y no conoces a nadie. Intentas integrarte y simplemente no funciona. Te preguntas: ¿por qué he venido? Estás deseando que termine. Lo que empeoró las cosas fue que tuvo lugar en la conferencia ALPHA. La hospitalidad es uno de sus valores principales. ALPHA se basa en hacer que los invitados se sientan bienvenidos y queridos.

Por desgracia, compartimentamos. Cuando estamos en la iglesia actuamos de cierta manera, fuera de ella, no tanto. Mis compañeros de mesa no tenían por qué relacionarse conmigo. Yo no les servía para nada. No iba a unirme a su iglesia. No era una persona reconocida en la iglesia. No tenían por qué hacer nada especial por mí. Lo más probable es que no volviéramos a vernos nunca más.

No podemos permitir que eso ocurra aquí. Cada vez que nos reunamos, mantén tu radar activo. Busca a la persona que está sola. Invítala a tu mesa o siéntate con ella junto con tu grupo. Aunque estés con tus amigos y realmente quieras disfrutar de su compañía, no lo conviertas en una prioridad. Poned a la otra persona en primer lugar. Presentáos. Empezad con una conversación general. Con el tiempo, probablemente se dividirá en conversaciones más pequeñas. No pasa nada. Solo aseguraos de que nadie se quede fuera.

Por favor, tened compasión por los que están fuera. Yo he estado ahí y estoy seguro de que vosotros también. No es divertido. Hagamos todo lo posible para que todos se sientan como en casa aquí, en Santa Teresa.


