



Sometimes when talking with my siblings, I like to bring up old memories. It gives me a chance to go back in time to relive those, often funny, moments and remember the loved ones no longer with us. For some reason, some of those fond memories I have or don't have, don't resonate with others the same.



When I was seven years old, I distinctly remember getting up in the middle of the night to some commotion in the hallway. I remember seeing some firemen there and couldn't figure out why they were upstairs at that time. I was told to go back to bed. The next day, I learned my mom was in the hospital (I learned a week or so later that she had a stroke) and to make us feel better, my brother Tom made sugar cookies with our housekeeper. My brother, always swore he didn't do that. How funny.

When I was about eight or nine years old, a bully threw my flippers in the lake at the Yacht club. My brother, Jerry, claims he dove down and retrieved them, so I didn't get in trouble with my father. He was sure my father would make me tell the bully's parents and that would make matters worse. This is a case of the opposite memory since I'm the one who doesn't remember the incident. You would think I would since my brother was usually on the other side of being helpful.

These are just some funny memories but there are the sad ones as well. When I relive the memories, both good and sad, I know that God is laughing with me about a funny event or holding me as I relive the sad. I don't mind so much reliving the sad because they often include a family member no longer with us. Remembering allows me to recall the love they left behind. That's how I want to be remembered, by the love I leave behind.

A veces, cuando hablo con mis hermanos, me gusta recordar viejos recuerdos. Mi hermano siempre juraba que no lo hacía. ¡Qué gracioso!

Cuando tenía unos ocho o nueve años, un abusador me tiró las aletas al lago del club náutico. Mi hermano Jerry afirma que se zambulló y los recuperó, así que no me metí en problemas con mi padre. Estaba seguro de que mi padre me obligaría a contárselo a los padres del abusador, lo que empeoraría las cosas. Este es un caso de la memoria contraria, ya que soy yo quien no recuerda el incidente. Uno pensaría que sí, ya que mi hermano solía ser más bien servicial.

Estos son solo algunos recuerdos divertidos, pero también hay algunos tristes. Cuando revivo los recuerdos, tanto buenos como tristes, sé que Dios se ríe conmigo de un suceso gracioso o me sostiene mientras revivo la tristeza. No me importa tanto revivir la tristeza porque a menudo incluye a un familiar que ya no está con nosotros. Recordar me permite evocar el amor que dejaron. Así es como quiero ser recordado, por el amor que dejo.

Twenty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time Looking Good

Don't you love it when the underdog wins? When the Cardinals beat the Yankees for the championship or the Blues beat the Redwings, or the Rams beat anyone? Even when I watch a game with no St. Louis teams playing, I still like to root for the underdog. That is what I like about today's Gospel: the last will be first and the first will be last.

Some say that Jesus was talking about the leaders of the Jews, the scribes and Pharisees. These refused to follow Jesus, while ordinary Jews who did not feel threatened by Jesus' teaching became disciples.

In a way, you can understand why the leaders rejected Jesus. They made a nice living out of the offerings made by ordinary Jews. And who could argue with them? They worked for God. How dare Jesus say that they would be cast out, while people from the rest of the world would enter the Kingdom of God!

And how about us? Remember that the Gospel was not written for non-believers. Are we threatened by Jesus' message? Just as the scribes and Pharisees considered themselves important in God's eyes because of their office, do we consider ourselves "saved" because we call ourselves Christians? Are we generous to the poor, or just to our friends? Do we follow our consciences or do we follow the crowd?


