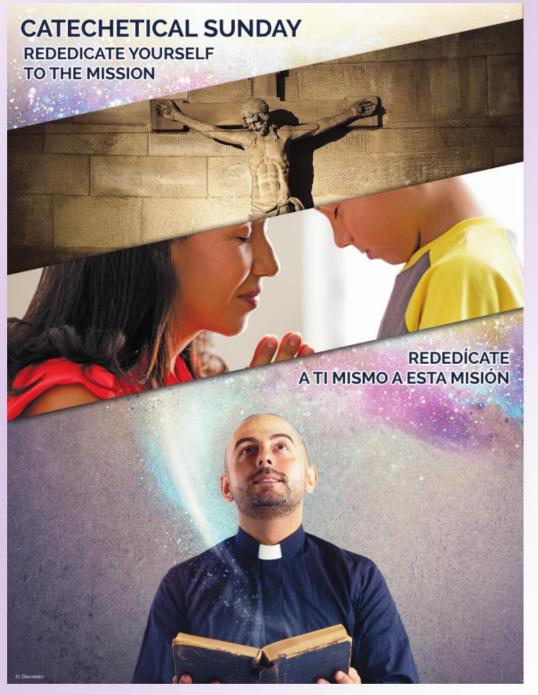

FROM FATHER TOM



"Hummingbirds defy gravity by flapping their wings fifty times per second. It's no wonder that one-quarter of their body weight is devoted to their pectoral muscles. No other form of locomotion requires a greater output of energy. Hummingbirds visit more than a thousand

flowers per day, flicking their tongues 15 times per second as they lick the nectar. Their tiny hearts beat 1,260 times per minute. They also take 250 breaths per minute without hyperventilating. It's no wonder that deep sleep is one of their superpowers. Their metabolic rate drops by 95 percent,

which is more than a hibernating bear. Hummingbirds have the fewest feathers of any bird species, but those feathers feature some spectacular colors. When Spanish explorers first saw them, they named them 'flying jewels'. Maybe that's why a group of hummingbirds is called a charm." — A Million Little Miracles: Rediscover the God Who Is Bigger Than Big, Closer Than Close, and Gooder Than Good by Mark Batterson

And you think you're busy! Even on our busiest day we are no match for the hummingbird's hectic schedule. The small, tiny hummingbird outlasts even the *Energizer* bunny. No wonder they sleep so well. Someone should have told them that what they are doing is not possible. They inspire me.

I hope they give you a little push as well. I realize many of you are retired. You have worked hard. Many of you have raised families. You climbed your mountains. I applaud you, but I also want to challenge you. While the good Lord still fills your lungs with breath, He expects you to continue to give back.

Have a purpose. Be a blessing. You will feel much better about yourself and probably, like the hummingbird, will sleep better at night. God is good to us, so be good to others.

Is it Sunday or the Sabbath?

For my family, Sundays evolved into the Lord's Day over years of discipline, then consistency, then practice, then intention. And still, it's a work in progress that, like any muscle, is strengthened over time.

When the boys were young, our Sundays were more "work" than anything. Our strong desire to put Christ first made the effort of going to Mass part of our routine. What was initially a hassle - that is, getting the boys to first wake up with enough time to eat, then wash up and tuck their buttoned shirts into their belted pants (the only time their insistence didn't win!) - became customary and a Sunday expectation.

Our involvement in youth ministry further made the routine a ritual, and our boys learned the importance of stewardship and fellowship. This practice began to spill beyond Sundays, and we discovered our community was the "family" we were missing in a town that was once foreign.

As the boys got older, Sundays became our family time. Without question, it was organically prioritized and praying together was the norm. Our boys are now young adults. And still, while Sundays compete with individual priorities, I am grateful we continue to celebrate Mass together.

Now with our nest half-empty, Jorge, my husband, and I continue to hold Sunday as a sacred time to honor our Lord and give gratitude to Him by giving pause on Life's distractions. Doing so brings attention to what's most important in life, which is our loved ones and the opportunity to REST, (as taught to me by a beloved Priest), for mental and spiritual wellbeing:

- Retreat;
- Enter into the presence of God;
- Sanctifying that time with Him and for Him; and
- Trusting in the guidance He offers.

I pray that we all find REST and discover ways to honor the Lord's Day as He calls us to do.

Para mi familia, los domingos se convirtieron en el Día del Señor tras años de disciplina, luego constancia, luego práctica, luego intención. Y aun así, es un trabajo en progreso que, como cualquier músculo, se fortalece con el tiempo.

Cuando los chicos eran pequeños, nuestros domingos eran más "trabajo" que cualquier otra cosa. Nuestro fuerte deseo de poner a Cristo primero hizo que el esfuerzo de ir a misa fuera parte de nuestra rutina. Nuestros hijos ahora son jóvenes adultos. Y aun así, aunque los domingos compiten con las prioridades individuales, agradezco que sigamos celebrando la misa juntos.

Ahora, con nuestro nido medio vacío, Jorge, mi esposo, y yo seguimos considerando el domingo como un tiempo sagrado para honrar a nuestro Señor y darle gracias, haciendo una pausa en las distracciones de la vida. Hacerlo nos lleva a lo más importante en la vida: nuestros seres queridos y la oportunidad de DESCANSAR (como me enseñó un amado sacerdote) para el bienestar mental y espiritual:

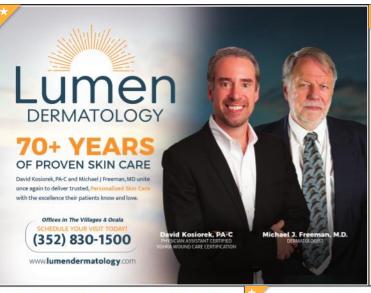
